2 Approval of minutes at the last meeting (19th November 2019)

3 Matters arising (not covered elsewhere on the agenda)

6 Funding requests from the Academy

TG provided a FOES and Lions Bid. There were four requests for funding in the FOES bid and one request in the Lions bid.

Funding requested = £750.

2. Lego Therapy Enrichment – this enrichment group will be open to all students in all year groups, but is specifically aimed at helping students with communication and interaction difficulties.

3. Visit to the school by the Shakespeare Youth Company to perform Romeo and Juliet for next year's year 10 pupils and possibly next year's year 11 students if the company allows.

Agreed to fund £720.

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Funding requested = £720.

Trip to Leeds to see a production of the Kite Runner.
 Funding requested = (a) £209 for tickets and (b) £180 for the bus.

Agreed to fund £180 for the bus.

Information was provided about a student that might benefit from support from Easingwold Lions. This will be passed on and actioned directly.

EW to pass this to the Lions.

It was noted that the English department and library receive most funding from FOES. TG to approach Maths department for requests for funding.

TG has submitted a business case to the Outwood board for funding a mini bus for the school. Estimated cost for a 16 seater mini bus is £25,000. Other associated costs include:

- Insurance £1000
- Petrol
- MIDAS training.
- Maintenance.

The mini bus would be used by the school to transport children to and from sports events, plays, debates, and other activities. At present there are approximately 16 school trips where a bus (with substantial cost) has to be hired. If a mini bus was available more trips may become financially possible.

The outcome of this business case may be known by the next FOES meeting, when it can be discussed further.

6 Updates from previous funding projects.

Robotics club continues to be very well attended. Construction of new sports hall is making good progress.
